DIRECTOR'S NOTE

It is 1928. The world is between wars, the stock market is booming, Berlin is the center of high life, and optimism rules the day. Underneath it all, much is happening at the elegant Grand Hotel, where the lives of its eccentric quests intersect over one defining weekend. Based on Vicky Baum's 1928 play and novel Menschen im Hotel (People in a Hotel) and the subsequent 1932 MGM feature film, issues of life and death, financial ruin, love and murder all converge as people come and go through the lobby of the Grand Hotel.

The show's 1989 Broadway production garnered 12 Tony Award nominations, winning five, including Best Direction and Choreography for Tommy Tune.

The themes of isolationism, broken dreams and cultural differences form the central messages of this musical messages that are all too relevant in our nation's current social and political climate. In the Weimar era (when the show unfolds), an anxious tension exists beneath the luxurious veneer of Grand Hotel. The world is on the brink of depression and war, and the chasm between the upper and lower classes is growing ever larger. I encourage you to keep these dynamics in mind as you encounter the harsh realities of each character's journey and to ponder our own future in a world deeply troubled by discord, conflict and division. In the musical, Otto Kringelein concludes that "life resides in people, not places." Especially now, that truth is more important than ever.

Their works for the stage include: Song of Norway (1944) (music adapted from Edvard Grieg), Gypsy Lady (1946) (music adapted from Victor Herbert), Magdalena (1948) (original music by Heitor Villa-Lobos), Kismet (1953) (music adapted from Alexander Borodin), Kean (1961), Anya (1965) (music adapted from Sergei Rachmaninoff), The Great Waltz (1970) (music adapted from Johann Strauss), Timbuktu! (1978) (reworking of Kismet), Grand Hotel The Musical (1989).

Maury Yeston (Additional Music & Lyrics) In addition to winning the Tony Award for Best Score for Titanic, Maury Yeston also won the Tony and two Drama Desk Awards for his music and lyrics to Broadway's Nine when it first appeared on Broadway in 1982. His work on Broadway's Grand Hotel was also nominated for a Tony and two Drama Desk Awards, and won London's Olivier Award in 2005. Yeston's music and lyrics cover a variety of styles. His Cello Concerto was premiered by Yo-Yo Ma, while his album Goya A Life in Song featured Placido Domingo and Gloria Estefan and included the song "Till I Loved You," subsequently a Top 40 Barbra Streisand hit. His classical crossover December Songs was commissioned by Carnegie Hall for its centennial celebration and recorded on RCA Records. Other Yeston works recorded on RCA Records include the score to his Phantom, which has received national and international acclaim, and the London Concert version of Nine, which starred Jonathan Pryce and Elaine Paige. In June 2003, he premiered his new book and musical adaptation of Frank Loesser's Hans Christian Andersen, now scheduled for worldwide production. Yeston holds a PhD. from Yale University and BA and MA degrees from both Yale and Cambridge. He was Associate Professor and Director of Undergraduate Music Studies at Yale for eight years, publishing two textbooks. Currently, he is Director of the BMI Music Theatre Workshop in New York City, a member of the Council of the Dramatists Guild and on the Board of the Songwriters Hall of Fame. He was named the 1997-1998 Kayden Visiting Artist at Harvard University and recently received The Elaine Kaufman Cultural Center Creative Arts Award and an Honorary Doctorate from Five Towns College.

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
